




























# Jim's Technical Tip

#### LUBRICATING LOCKS



The best lubricant I have found for car door locks, trunk handle locks, and ignition locks, recommended by every locksmith that I know, is dry powdered graphite.



You buy the graphite in a small tube with a pointed tip. You insert the tip into the keyhole and "puff" some graphite into the lock. Then you insert and remove the key several times to work the graphite into the lock tumblers and operate the lock a few times.






#### Thanks to the Fort Worth Model A Club December Newsletter

This month is also a good time to remember Edsel Ford who was born on November 6, 1893. As the only child of Henry and Clara Ford, Edsel was brought up in the family business. Although he was named President of Ford Motor Company in 1919, his father remained the company's patriarch. Much has been written about how Henry dominated, even demeaned, his son, but Edsel was responsible for much of Ford's success during the late 1920s and throughout the 1930s. He died in 1943. It was Edsel who bought Lincoln in 1922. In the mid-1920s he was instrumental in convincing Henry that the Model T had become obsolete and needed to be replaced with a more modern car if Ford was to maintain its leadership in the industry. Edsel had a flare for automotive design that first showed up on Lincolns; it is no coincidence that the Model A is often referred to as the "Baby Lincoln." Although Henry Ford was a mechanical genius, Edsel deserves much of the credit for the overall design and quality of the Model A. Given that we share a passion for the car he had so much to do with, Edsel Ford deserves our respect and admiration.

#### 7 Step Guide for The Do-It-Yourself Handyman


- If you can't find a screwdriver, use a knife. If you break off the tip, it's an improved screwdriver.


