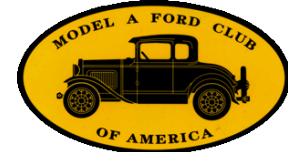

Self-Generating Headlamps

Using a motor vehicle at night required illumination to see where one was going. As with horse-drawn carriages, early automobiles had lamps fueled by kerosene. These needed to be replenished with fuel fairly often, and a lamp that needed less attention to function soon came into being. Calcium carbide and mixed water produce acetylene gas that can be used to power lamps if lit with matches.

Carbide tanks were usually mounted to the chassis area of a car just before or aft of the vertical wood dash panel that separated the engine from the drive. A rubber tube connected the brass line that exited the carbide tank where the water and carbide crystals were mixed.

All of this worked well and was used on most vehicles. They were manufactured by a variety of companies, usually not the car manufacturers themselves. The carbide lamps and tanks were obviously feet apart distance-wise and accessory manufacturers determined a lamp that would generate light in one unit would be much more convenient. The lamp would be much larger and heavier, as would the bracket to hold it in place, which had to be stouter to do so.



The lamp you view here was "British Made" by Powell & Hamner of Birmingham, England. It is 10 ½ inches high, 11 inches long, and 6 inches wide with an 8 ¾ inch front rim. The cylindrical container inside was removeable and connected to the "wick" where the gas would be lit.

The lamps were lit by a match after the acetylene gas was formed mixing the carbide crystals with water. Once lit, it could be adjusted to get a larger or smaller flame. This lamp does not have a thick glass mirror reflector at the back but instead uses polished metal liners to reflect light in the body and on the rim. The brass lamp would get very hot! As heat was conducted, numerous holes, as can be seen, were made to function to let the heat escape. Note how well the holes also added to the design/appearance.

I and the 2026 Board of Directors are eagerly looking forward to making 2026 a memorable year. 100 Years Ago at the Ford Motor Company

In the early months of 1926, the Ford Motor Company was busy producing the updates to the Model T, featuring new commercial variants and updated factory accessories. During the spring, customers started seeing wire wheels, new factory bumpers, and factory-installed stop lights on new roll-outs.



April 1926 was a very busy month as Ford was preparing to become one of the first companies in the United States to implement the 5-day-a-week, 40-hour work week to start May 1. As we mentioned last month, Henry Ford's motivations were to promote employee well-being, increase productivity, and foster a sense of loyalty among its factory workers.

It was back in 1914 that Ford had raised the minimum wage for male workers to \$5 an hour for the eight-hour day. That minimum wage, however, was not extended to females until 1919.

After Ford's new 40-hour work week went into effect, many manufacturers across the United States began to institute the same. Some companies were hold-outs however, and some for decades. As late as the 1980s, there was at least one major manufacturing company located in Fort Worth that required employees to work a half day on Saturday.
